I am pleased to welcome you to the Department of Youth, Sport & Recreation's 2022/23 Sport Investment Programme highlights and announcement, which sets out the core funding for National Sport Governing Bodies for fiscal year 2023/24. The Department of Youth, Sport & Recreation is committed to enhancing sport and recreation at all levels and recognizes that sports associations must be supported to ensure their growth and development. A key focus is to assist our National Sport Governing Bodies (NSGBs) in developing sustainable and effective pathway structures to facilitate an increased number of participants and improve performance. In this regard, the Department commits to funding NSGBs through the Sport Investment Program (SIP). The SIP provides funding to National Sports Governing Bodies to support and assist with developing athletes, coaches and sporting programs.

The increasing number of recognized NSGBs bodes well for sport in Bermuda as organizations continue to show good governance and development. The Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation will continue to provide a transparent process for NSGBs to access funding based on the principles of accountability, equity and outcomes. Accordingly, the Government's deep commitment to sport will continue with this programme and others to show that Sport Matters!

National Sport Governing Bodies (NSGB's)

The National Sport Governing Bodies (NSGBs) recognized by the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation are at the center of Bermuda sport. Assisting recognized NSGB's to develop sustainable and effective frameworks to facilitate increased numbers of participants and volunteers in sport is a vital objective of the Department.

Sport Investment Program Framework


The Department wishes to see a diverse range of sports available to the Bermudian public and continues to invest in a wide variety of NSGBs as we look to meet outcomes surrounding increased participation and improved performance, as indicated in the *Bermuda National Sports Policy, 2022–27*.

The Department will look to measure progress in achieving outcomes, and assist NSGBs to do so, drawing on evidence to learn and improve. NSGB funding allocations will be reviewed annually, and the Department will invest more in any organization/program doing particularly well. The Department will stop investing if an organization/program isn't meeting expected outcomes over a period of time. The Department invest in the following categories:

High Performance: Investment in High Performance through the Elite Athlete Fund, which is managed by the Bermuda Olympic Association. Funding will also be provided to NSGBs to assist with the delivery of their senior and junior National programs and any other elite pathway.

Junior Development/Programming: Investment in grassroots and senior programs to increase development, sustainability and performance. Programs such as these are imperative for the future progression of all NSGB's. The Department will also invest in necessary equipment associated with these programs to ensure feasibility.

Coach Development: Investment in coach education will ensure there are quality local coaches within each respective NSGB as this will assist with achieving Department priorities for NSGBs with athlete retention and performance.



The Department of Youth Sport and Recreation via the Sport Investment Program issued a total of **\$1,486,000** during the **2022-23** fiscal year to National Sport Governing Bodies and sport organizations.



NSGBs received a total of **\$485,000** towards High Performance

NSGBs received a total of **\$200,000** towards Junior Development/ Programming



NSGBs received a total of **\$100,000** towards Coaching Development



Bermuda Olympic Association received **\$100,000** towards operations



Bermuda Sport-Anti Doping Authority (BSADA) received **\$586,000** towards operations



Bermuda Olympic Association received **\$14,500** through the 'Outstanding Athletic Performance Incentive Program' for Flora Duffy Gold Medal (**\$10,000**) and Jah-Nhai Perinchief Bronze Medal (**\$4,500**) at the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England.


