CODY REGO COMPLETES FLORIDA'S 2023 WINTER EQUESTRIAN FESTIVAL AND IS AWARDED A PRESTIGIOUS CHAMPIONSHIP!

The Winter Equestrian Festival is said to be the largest and longest running equestrian competition in the world. Held in Wellington, Florida it runs for 12 weeks from January through to March and attracts between 7,000 – 8,000 horses from around the world. In the final week of competition, Bermuda's Cody Rego continued his stellar performance that he has displayed consistently throughout the equestrian festival. Riding 'Ironman', Cody clinched four top placings! Cody was claimed 1st placed in WIHS Hunter Phase, 1st Place in the Dover Saddlery/USEF Seat Medal, and 1st place in the ASPCA Maclay (Section B).

Further, and in recognition of Cody's outstanding and consistent achievements throughout the 12-week equestrian Festival, Cody was presented with the prestigious 'Christy Conrad Perpetual' Trophy. This coveted trophy is awarded to the junior who has accumulated the most points in the USEF Medal, WIHS, USEF Talent Search, ASPCA McClay and the WIHS Overall equitation classes throughout the 12-week circuit.

Congratulations Cody on your outstanding performances and laudable achievements throughout the WEF circuit as well as attaining the Championship! In addition, Cody remains in the top spot, out of 100 riders on the WIHS Rankings; the finals of which will take place in October. Cody was a recipient Bermuda's National Junior Athlete Recognition and Sponsorship Award for 2022.

BERMUDA SHOW JUMPERS ACHIEVE STRONG RESULTS IN 2023 FEI JUMPING WORLD CHALLENGE

The FEI Jumping World Challenge (JWC) is indeed a highlight on Bermuda's equestrian calendar. The competition is unique in that it provides local riders an opportunity to compete internationally without having to leave their own country. Rather, riders from 10 different geographical zones compete over the same jumping course designed by an FEI appointed course designer. The Challenge provides for Individual classification per Country, per Geographical Zone and per height category. It also offers a Team classification per Geographical Zone. The best results from 2 of the 3 rounds of competition, per category, are applied to the Overall rankings.

Bermuda's third and final round of the 2023 FEI Challenge was held at the National Equestrian Centre on Saturday 8th April. The results for the third round are as follows:

Category A: (1.20 – 1.30m)

The highest height division of the Challenge, **Philip Correia** riding his grey stallion, 'Junior Cardento' captured 1st place with accumulative 4 faults and time of 61.42.

Category B: (1.10 – 1.20m)

Tyler James and 'Cruise Control' sailed to top spot with accumulative 4 faults and time of 57.74.

Category C: (1.00m – 1.10m)

McKeisha Smith riding 'Da Vinci' claimed the top spot with an accumulative 4 faults and an impressive time of 54.12.

With the successful completion of the three requisite competitions that comprise the Challenge, Bermuda's OVERALL PROVISIONAL RESULTS for its top placing competitors, in each of the 3 jumping height categories, is as follows:

OVERALL PROVISIONAL RESULTS

Category A

Philip Correia riding Junior Cardento with an accumulation of 8 faults and time of 107.42.

Category B

Tyler James with 8 accumulative faults and time 118.81

Category C

Michael Rodrigues and Rambo with zero accumulative faults and time of 115.52.

With competitors in A, B, & C categories, Bermuda is also able to field a 2023 team comprising of overall top placing Philip Correia, Tyler James and Michael Rodrigues.

Competing countries have until December 31st, 2023 in which to complete their jumping competitions. As such, the final overall results will not be confirmed until early 2024. Judging Bermuda's final phase of the competition was FEI Level 3 Judge Cathy Harper of Canada and Bermuda's FEI Level 1 Judges Heidi Shelley Mello and Pam Mahoney.

Renowned for its technical demands, the race was held on one of the most unique courses on the road cycling calendar.

The criterium race is a timed lapped competition on a closed circuit set. The course in St. Georges, with its Water Street cobbles and tight turns, was ideal for criterium racing as it required great skill and power from the riders to maintain speed and float over the obstacles. The races were hard-fought in every category, with the competitors pushing themselves to the limit.

The BRCC would like to express their gratitude to the team at the Corporation of St. George and the people of the town for hosting the race and providing invaluable assistance. Their support made it possible for the BRCC to organize an event that is a favorite with both riders and spectators.

Bermuda Cyclists Impress in Pan American Championships U23 – Road Race

Bermuda's **Nic Narraway** and **Liam Flannery** delivered strong performances at the Pan American Championships U23 – Road Race (CC) held today. The challenging 153.6 km race in Panama saw early breakaways by powerful riders which held for most of the race, leaving Nic and Liam in the peloton over three minutes behind the leaders.

However, the duo's patience and strategic play paid off in the last 24 km when they started to pull back the leaders. Although the first four cyclists had already crossed the finish line, Nic and Liam, who finished in 11th and 19th place respectively, managed to close the time gap with the peloton only 39 seconds behind the leader.

The intense heat and tough conditions didn't stop the Bermuda cyclists from putting on a remarkable display of sportsmanship and determination. Their performance in this challenging race serves as a testament to their skills and resilience, making Bermuda proud. The success of Nic Narraway and Liam Flannery at the Pan American Championships U23 – Road Race was not only a result of their hard work and dedication but also due to the invaluable support they received from Team Bermuda on the ground.



The 50th Carifta Games, Nassau Bahamas

The 2023 CARIFTA took place April 7 - 10, 2023 in Nassau, Bahamas and the 50th edition of the games was nothing short of spectacular. With 28 countries from the Caribbean represented, we had our work cut out for us.

Bermuda's team of 29 athletes were some of the youngest fielded amongst the island competitors. One thing is for certain, our island may be small in size but the fight and determination displayed from our athletes was anything but!

Prior to the event, The Minister of Youth, Culture and Sport Senator Owen Darrell stated, "CARIFTA has always seen some incredible performances by our young athletes. These games have launched the sports careers and dreams of many of our young Bermudian athletes. Bermuda's track and field and swim teams recorded amazing results at last year's Jamaica games. This year, we have an equally talented 2023 CARIFTA Team, and I am confident we will accumulate more gold, silver and bronze medals during this week's Games."

The prediction was certain to come true only days later with Bermuda's team bringing home 5 medals, numerous PBs (personal bests) and athletes who described their experience as priceless!

Please join us in congratulating Bermuda's Carifta Team who left nothing but their bests on the track at the Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium in Nassau!

Under-20 Boys

Bermuda's first medal came on the opening day of competition with **Khazi Sealy** finishing as runner-up in the 1,500 meters. Sealey would then go on to add to his collection by acquiring a second silver medal in the 5,000 meters, and would share the podium with compatriot **Jake Brislane** who clinched bronze. **Kallan Richardson** also competed in the 1500m, keeping pace with the many competitors. The 5000m race showed what true teamwork was about as the duo raced side by side throughout, working together to ensure both keep pace for medal contention over the multi lap event.

Bermuda's octathlon athlete, **J'Auza James** clinched a bronze, after the 17-year-old sealed his podium finish with a gutsy performance in the final event (1500m). Despite enduring an injury from the prior high jump event, James led the way at a grueling pace for the majority of the 1500m race and would ultimately finish second behind St. Kitts & Nevis. James's accumulated points throughout the 8 events (over 2 days) proved enough to earn Bermuda a bronze in the octathlon.

Of honorable mention is **Sancho Smith**, who looked set to win a medal in the 800 meters, but was caught on the finishing straight and narrowly missed out on a podium position by three tenths of a second.

Honorable mention is also extended to **Denver Tucker** who competed in 100m and 200m. Tucker, competing against athletes 2-3 years his senior, and will have more opportunities in years ahead. **Seer Carey** competed in the 400m and 4x400m relay medley, giving it his all on the track.

Razai Garland competed in the shot put as Bermuda's sole male thrower and performed well!

Under-20 Girls

The U20 girls comprised of **Shayla Cann** who competed in the 400m, 800m and 4x400m relay, **Sanaa Rae Morris** who competed in the 200m and 4x400m relay, **I'aura Golding** who competed in the 110m hurdles, and 4x400m relay and **Zenji Washington** competing in the 100m, 200m and 4x400m relay. Our U20 girls gave it their all across their respective events and combined forces in the relay.

Kesay Bell competed in the shot put and javelin. Bearing much pressure as Bermuda's sole female thrower, Bell competed well during the multi day event.

Under-17 Boys

As the honorable mentions continue, you'll see just how stiff the Carifta competition is and how close Bermuda was in multiple occasions to podium position.

Of honorable mention was **Tajahri Rogers**, who finished just outside the podium position in the 1,500. **Miles Outerbridge**, **Daylen Scott, Tajahri Rogers** and **Kyah Richardson** together made up the U17 Boys 4x100m relay. The team, most of whom were competing for the first time at Carfita, gave an impressive performance and narrowly missed out on advancing to the finals by 1 tenth of a second!

Cameron Adkins took part in the 3000m, also competing in his first Carifta games and gave a valiant effort in the multi lap event.

Under-17 Girls

Bermuda's fifth medal came from the U17 girls 4x100m relay team. J'Naz Richards, Pria Wilson, Arima Turner and Lashee Jones ran a time of 48.12sec.

Of honorable mention was **Jaeda Grant**, who finished fourth in the 1,500 meters. Grant would go on to compete with her compatriot **Fenella Wightman** in a challenging open division 3000m race. The two ran a strong race amongst athletes who were 3-4 years their senior; they'll have an additional 4 years of competition in the open bracket so stay tuned!

Also of honorable mention, is **Ellise Dickinson** who demonstrated sheer toughness and tenacity, advancing to the semi-finals in the 400m event and the final of the 200m event, where she placed seventh.

Finalizing our U17 girls is **Azari Jones** and **Amaris Munya**, both of whom competed in the 800m along with the relay medley demonstrating admirable perseverance. Jones and Munya accompanied Dickinson and Grant in the 4x400m relay and finished 4th narrowly missing a podium position.

Thanks to the National Junior Athlete Scholarship Program and the Department of Youth, Sport & Recreation, Bermuda students were recently delighted to receive Dorian Bostic for a week-long visit and boxing clinic in March.

Bostic is a professional boxer [13W-0L-0D] fighting out of Baltimore, Maryland who recently was signed to Don King Promotions. He goes by the moniker "The Educated Boxer", as he is currently working towards a PhD. in Human Services. Once attained, Bostic will be the first African-American professional boxer to earn such accolades. Bostic works in social service and is also the author of "Why I Fight", an autobiography of his life. His first visit to Bermuda was in 2017, where he faced then amateur national champion Andre Lambe.

As part of his visit, Bostic spoke to the young people in the Cedarbridge Academy Boxing Club and at the Family Center 'Beyond Boxing' program about his struggles growing up in the U.S. foster care system. Bostic discussed avoiding gangs and violence and about being resilient. The reality of gun violence, however, struck for Bostic even whilst in Bermuda as minutes before he was due to engage students in the boxing clinic he learned of the death of a friend and colleague, fellow professional boxer Ernest Hall who was killed in a mass shooting incident in west Baltimore. Bostic remained resolute, urging students to strive for success.

The Bermuda Boxing Federation also hosted a successful webinar entitled "Becoming a Champion of Life" alongside the Association of Sports National Governing Bodies (ANSGB) and the Family Centre, where Bostic again spoke. Also participating in the forum was host, Earl Basden of islandstats.com, professional boxer Nikki Bascome, retired police inspector and sailing administrator Mark Clarke, football coach Dennis Brown and counselor Latoya Bridgewater of the Family Centre. This panel discussed the role of sport and mentorship.
